## Biographical History

Louis Akin (1868-1913) was a painter famous for his images of southwest. In 1903 Akin was hired by the Sante Fe Railway to paint images of the Hopi Indians and the Grand Canyon. He was working on a project for the American Museum of Natural History when he died in 1913.

## Scope and Content

Collection is comprised of 3 photographs of Akin, two of which are him painting at the Grand Canyon. Also included is correspondence and poetry written by Akin to his friend "Billy" Crane and information pertaining to Akin's death and estate, including correspondence between W.B Crane and Akin's lawyer, a newspaper clipping and an inventory of Akin's estate.
