# **Biographical History**

Dr. Clarence G. Salsbury was a Presbyterian medical missionary who served in both China and on the Navajo reservation in Arizona. In 1930 he founded the Sage Memorial Hospital School of Nursing at the Ganado Mission where he was medical director. The school was the first to focus on the education of Native American women in the nursing profession.

# **Scope and Content**

The collection contains 2 photographs of the Navajo Chautauqua which was held at Ganado in 1934 and an aerial photograph of the mission from that same year. In addition there is a letter from Salsbury to Mary-Russell Colton briefly describing the Chautauqua.
