Biographical History

Louis Grundel (8 January 1896-3 February 1975) was the son of J.H. Grundel, who was a surveyor for the Atlantic & Pacific Railroad during its construction. While working for Atlantic & Pacific, J.H. acquired these photographs, but it is unclear who the original creator was.

Scope and Content

Collection consists of photographic material documenting the construction of the Atlantic & Pacific Railroad from Albuquerque, New Mexico to Needles, California. The Atlantic & Pacific Railroad later became part of the St. Louis and San Francisco Railway, which subsequently was absorbed by the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway, and has now been incorporated into the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railway Company.
