Biographical History

Dixon Fagerberg, Jr. served as Vice-Chairman on the Coconino County Planning and Zoning board from 1972-1975. During this time, Summit Properties appealed the 1972 zoning decision to restrict development of the Hart Prairie area at the base of the San Francisco Peaks. This development would have expanded the commercial area around the Snow Bowl ski resort. Mr. Fagerberg collected his notes and correspondence from these meetings and donated them to the Museum of Northern Arizona in 1976.

Scope and Content

Collection contains correspondence, agendas, notes, judicial papers, and clippings relating to the March 26, 1974 meeting of the Coconino County Planning and Zoning board to decide upon the Summit Properties appeal.
