As a Docent at MNA, you will have the chance to: Interact with Museum curators, learn from Native American experts and go on behind the scenes tours.

Interested persons are encouraged to apply for acceptance into docent training, which begin October 10, 2017 and continues through March 30, 2018. Classes are every Tuesday between 10 AM and 12.30 PM. Limited seats are available.

Sessions consist of experts speaking about the people, geology, archeology and history of the Colorado Plateau and the Museum itself. Upon completion of the training, guides conduct tours for adults or interactive programs for school children. On-going educational opportunities and field trips for docents are also offered.
