# MNA Juried Competition Classification and Divisions 2023 Heritage Festival

**Best of Show** (\$500) – Awarded to a work of art that is the most exceptional entry in terms of skill, creativity, originality, and execution. This may be given to any classification.

**MNA Spirit Award** (\$300) – Awarded to a work of art that best represents the Museum of Northern Arizona's mission\*\* (see below). This may not be the most technical or intricate piece, but rather should be representative of the museum.

\*\* MNA is a gateway to understanding the Colorado Plateau, engaging local, regional and global audiences with life-enriching knowledge and experiences.

# Classification 1 2-D Fine Art (Painting / Drawings / Mixed Media)

Examples of entries include: paintings, drawings, and mixed media. Pieces should display-ready; however, pieces without proper matting and framing may still be considered for awards. *No entry may exceed 72" at its greatest dimension including frame.*

# Classification 2 Photography, Printmaking & Digital Arts

Examples of entries include: inkjet prints, gelatin silver prints, hand-pulled prints, lithographs, serigraphs. Editions of no more than 50, each numbered and signed. Items made in mass quantity, including mugs, cards, and t-shirts are not allowed.

#### Classification 3 Jewelry

Jewelry must be handmade of natural materials and must comply with the applicable federal and state regulations regarding natural materials. Organic, stone, and clearly identified non-plated metal (e.g., gold or silver) materials are allowed. Acceptable commercial findings include pearls and glass beads, cones, clasps, hooks/eyes, earring backs, bolo backs, pin backs, tiger tail, and fox tail. Commercially strung pieces will not be accepted. Artists may enter one piece from a matched set individually or as a matched set. All pieces are required to have artists hallmark or stamp.

# Classification 5 Sculpture

This category includes all hand-wrought materials, such as stone, metal, ceramic, wood, and cloth. Artists should disclose types of wood used in carvings. Cast resins, cast miniatures, and commercially manufactured stands are not allowed. *No entry may exceed 60" at its greatest dimension.*

# Classification 6 Pueblo Weavings & Textiles (Zuni, Hopi, Acoma, Laguna)

Weavings may be done on vertical or horizontal looms. Items may include sashes, blankets, belts or vests. Finger weaving, knitting, crochet, twined plaiting and embroidery are acceptable techniques. The predominate material may not include commercially made items, manufactured or non-Indian made die-struck metal buttons or conchos, plastic beads or buttons, however, it is acceptable to have a small component of these materials.

#### Classification 8 Personal Attire & Accessories
