Heritage Festival Celebrates Indigenous Art and Culture June 27-29 at Museum of Northern Arizona

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. — Celebrate the Indigenous people of the Colorado Plateau during the 2025 Heritage Festival of Arts and Culture June 27-29 at the Museum of Northern Arizona.

The annual festival features 100 Native American artists selling their one-of-a-kind creations, including jewelry, textiles, pottery, fine art, basketry, kachinas, and more. The artists receive 100% of earnings from their sales.

The festivities include traditional music and dances from the Pueblo Dance Group, DinéTah Navajo Dancers, and Ryon Polequatewa and friends. Enjoy live contemporary music from Diné artists Hataalii and Jacob Jacques on Saturday and from the Hopi hard rock and metal group the Descendant Band on Sunday.

Diné artist Jaymus Perry presents a cultural talk on anthill garnets in the Navajo tradition. There will be art activities and culture-focused puppet shows for children, plus food vendors and picnic tables for all to enjoy.

Don't miss out on this unique cultural experience. Tickets range from \$10 to \$25 and are available now and at the festival entrance. Children 9 and under enjoy free entry. A festival ticket includes entry to the museum and its exhibits. Parking is free.
